- 2. The coach is enthusiastic about his task and would like to share it with his players.
- 3. The coach ensures that his training is challenging for the players.
- 4. The coach ensures that children are touched and that they remain motivated.
- 5. The coach focuses on the participation and self-direction of the players and does as much as possible with the players together.
- 6. The coach can put things into perspective and has humor.
- 7. The coach stays in contact with players, even when he sets boundaries.
- 8. The coach is interested in the environment of his players.
- 9. The coach can adapt to the dynamics of the group.
- 10. The coach creates a group when it comes to real contact.
- 11. The coach is a guide for his players, a 'moral compass'.
